# **Night of Historic Wins:**

On Tuesday November 4, the country saw a series of historic electoral wins. Across the east coast, women were victorious in Governor races. Abigail **Spanberger** became Governor of Virginia, the first woman to ever hold the title. New Jersey elected Mikie **Sherrill** to be its second female Governor. **Ghazala Hashmi** won the lieutenant governor's race in Virginia, becoming the first Muslim woman elected to statewide office in any state. Detroit, Michigan elected Mary Sheffield as the first woman mayor of the city. The entire country had their attention on the mayoral race in New City. **Zohran Mamdani**, a York Ugandan immigrant, is now the first Muslim to be the Mayor of NYC. # **ICE and Young Children**

On November 5, fully armed ICE agents arrested a daycare worker in Chicago. Witnesses claimed that excessive force was used. As the woman was dragged out of the daycare without a warrant, the children were watching, horrified and scared. Prior to the Trump administration, child care centers were considered 'sensitive locations' under ICE policy. The Trump administration removed this policy shortly after the Inauguration. These deportation efforts will drastically impact children across the United States because 1 in 5 daycare workers nationwide are immigrants. To learn more about this situation, click here.

Representative Pete Aguilar serves as Chairman of the House Democratic Caucus, making him the highest-ranking Latino in the U.S. House of Representatives. Throughout his career, he has been a passionate advocate for his constituents, ensuring their voices are heard at every level of government.

Pinterest implemented AI-generated warning labels on anything suspected to be made with AI. This maintains a level of transparency throughout the app. Their latest feature is allowing users to filter out genAI content from their experience. Within personal settings, a user can limit the AI-generated content they see. By giving users this level of control, Pinterest is not only empowering its community but also reinforcing its commitment to supporting authentic creative expression and preserving the value of human artistry.

While speaking, Congressman Joaquin Castro (TX-20) stated, "NHMC works to make sure that the Latino community is defined by reality: a community that has contributed in every single positive way to the prosperity and the development of the United States of America and has done it now for generations."
